789 <u>CONSIDERATION OF FITNESS OF LICENSED PRIVATE HIRE</u> DRIVER TO OPERATE ON BEHALF OF SELBY DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Licensing Officer presented a report asking Members to consider the fitness of the driver to operate as a Private Hire Driver.

The Licensing Officer outlined details of the case regarding an investigation by Police following an allegation of assault.

The driver concerned outlined details of the case and Members questioned the driver as to the full circumstances of the incident.

RESOLVED:

That the driver is considered to be a fit and proper person to be licensed to drive a Private Hire Vehicle and the suspension of his licence be lifted.

790 APPLICATION BE HACKNEY CARRIAGE DRIVER FOR A HACKNEY CARRIAGE LICENCE

The Licensing Officer presented a report asking Members to consider an application for the grant of a hackney carriage licence for a Ford Escort, a vehicle not fully accessible to disabled users, on the grounds of hardship.

The Licensing Officer outlined details of the case, adding that this was this particular operator's second application on grounds of hardship.

RESOLVED: That the application for a Hackney Carriage Licence be granted in respect of the vehicle, with the vehicle being exempted from the requirement for it to be fully accessible to the disabled, on the basis that hardship grounds had been satisfied.

HACKNEY CARRIAGE TARIFFS AND FEES

Members received the report of the Head of Service – Legal and Democratic Services in respect of the annual review of the hackney carriage tariffs and licensing fees.

The Licensing Officer provided Members with a summary of proposals for tariffs which had been drawn up following notification to, and consultation with licence holders by the Council over a period from October 2005.

Mr Hawksworth spokesperson for some licence holders was in attendance for this item and handed out a new proposal of charges for Members to consider.

After consideration, Members endorsed the proposals put forward by the Licensing Officer.

Members considered the proposed licence fees and agreed the fees set out in the report which indicated an increase of 6% over the next two years.

RESOLVED:

- (i) That the tariff increase be as the one proposed in the report;
- (ii) That the licensing fees be increased by 6% over the next two years.
