##### 1. ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN

##### 4. APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE FOR MACE, MILLGATE SERVICE STATION, SELBY

In attendance and entitled to speak on this application were:

Mr S Gibson representing the applicants.

Tim Grogan (Licensing Officer) gave a summary of his report. He advised that the application was for a Premises Licence for the sale of alcohol set out in the summary of the report.

The application was for premises known as Mace, Millgate Service Station, 142 Millgate, Selby. The applicant had requested that alcohol could be sold from 06.30 – 23.00 Monday to Saturday (inclusive) and 07.00 – 23.00 (Sunday).

The Licensing Officer outlined the decision options open to the Committee together with options available for possible appeals.

Mr Gibson advised the sub committee that the premises were primarily used as a shop by the local community. He submitted details of sales figures for the period September to November 2009 which indicated that 37% of customers purchased fuel and 63% were shop customers. The granting of a licence would allow the applicants to provide an improved service to the local community. The applicants ran similar premises in other areas of Northern England and were fully aware of the need to prevent the purchase of alcohol by those under 18.

Councillors and the Licensing Officer questioned the applicant's representative on the information submitted.

After the applicant's representative and the Licensing Officer confirmed that they had received a fair hearing the Sub-Committee adjourned to debate their decision.

**Resolved:**

**That consideration of the application be deferred until 8 April 2010 to enable the primary use issue to be resolved.**
