Details of decision:	In October 2020 the government announced Covid-19 grant support for businesses in further local and national lockdowns. Additional Restrictions Grant Scheme (ARG) was provided to support businesses who have been severely impacted by a national or local lockdown and are not eligible for the Local Restrictions Support Grant (LRSG).
	In January 21 the Government announced a further £500m in ARG funding to support businesses through the second national lockdown. The Council was awarded £805k from this second tranche of funding; increasing the Council's total allocation to £2.6m. To date approximately £2.2m of this

Reason for decision:	To administer the government's Additional Restrictions Grant Scheme to assist businesses severely affected by Covid-19 local and national lockdowns.

	RESOLVED:
	That as the matter is urgent, and the decision cannot await a full meeting of the Executive due to the need to put in place arrangements as part of the Covid-19 response.
	As the decision is a Key Decision the Chair of Scrutiny has been consulted and agreed that the decision cannot be reasonably deferred, and that the decision is genuinely urgent.
	The Council's ARG Policy has been revised (see attached Appendix A) to include new provisions contained in Section 5 of the Policy.
	The Council is expected to implement measures to provide immediate help to businesses.
	In March 2021 the Government announced that a further £425m ARG funding would be made available to local authorities. however, BEIS, who administer the Business Support and ARG grant schemes, have stated that this allocation will only be paid out if the previous amounts have been contractually committed or spent by 30 th June. If existing ARG monies cannot be contractually committed by that time, there is a risk that the businesses will lose out on the potential third tranche of ARG funding.
	amount has been paid out in discretionary business support grants.

Legal, Financial or other implications:	The ARG scheme is being fully funded by the Government through Section 31 grant payments and will be administered by local authorities.
	Fully documented decisions by officers of the grants applied to accounts will be made to ensure all requirements are fulfilled. Local authorities are required to report weekly to central government the numbers and value of grants that have been issued. This report will be submitted using the DELTA system.
	The decision is within the Budget and Policy Framework therefore there is no requirement to consult the Chair of Policy on this occasion.
	As the decision is made under urgency powers it is not subject to call-in. The Chief Executive confirms that the decision proposed is reasonable in all the circumstances and is to be treated as urgent.
