<b>Details of decision:</b>	<p><b>RESOLVED: To grant £1,000 to assist in the delivery of the bridge celebrations.</b></p> <p>For street entertainment/performance to accompany a day of celebrations marking 5 years since the bridge was reopened after the flooding.            Other funding is provided via the Welcome Back Fund.            The funding will be provided to TEMPT.            The funding should be used to commission street performance to accompany the event – this will be music and children's/family entertainment, similar to that programmed by SDC for the Super SaTADay event.</p>

	The event will be delivered by community volunteers.
<b>Reason for decision:</b>	As to do so is in accordance with the legislation and Council Constitution. Scheme of Delegation Section 3.9 to provide grants and other financial assistance. Part 1 of the Localism Act 2011 applies a general power of competence to local authorities in England. Section 1 (1) of the Act provides that “a local authority has power to do anything that individuals generally may do”. This includes the power to make grants where to do would be in the interests of the Council, the District and the inhabitants.
