The Monday Club had a broad membership, continued to flourish making many contacts with outside agencies, Tesco food fair, Fryns Nemo's fish shop at Colton, Purple patch, a police constable became a regular visitor. The club also embarked its outward about activities taking people on trips using A.V.S. minibuses. In Sept 2016 our driver completed mini bus training at Bedale Community Transport. Using the A.V.S. mini buses the driver reported a number of faults. On 17th December 2016

the driver, on picking up the 16 seater mini bus, ~~he~~ found the bus to be totally saturated, and the rear seats loose.

Any other comments on the project and its success:

We had no emergency contact number for A.V.S. the driver

had to obtain bin liners to cover the seats to allow the 16 vulnerable members to get to the party at Goolle, which was prepared and they were looking forward to. On bringing to the attention to the manager at A.V.S. he said ~~that~~ if it was not fit for purpose we should not have used it in the first place. The driver continued to demand payment from our treasurer showing a total lack of respect for our members and volunteers. The Trustees had a meeting, and decided that with the stress from A.V.S. there was no longer any enjoyment in running a
