**Title: Statement of Licensing Policy 2020**

- 1.2 A statutory consultation process began on the 29 June 2020 and will finish on the 10 August 2020. This is the opportunity for the local community to comment on the proposed Statement of Licensing Policy 2020 ("the Policy").
